SOUTHERN BLACK LAND STEWARDS PRESENTED BY THE LOLA HAMPTON-FRANK PINDER CENTER FOR AGROECOLOGY IN 1932 MY FATHER PURCHASED 207 ACRES OF LAND IN JEFFERSON COUNTY, FL. MY FATHER PAID \$3,600 FOR THE PURCHASE OF THE PROPERTY. HE HAD 15 CHILDREN, 9 BOYS AND 6 GIRLS. WE ALL WORKED ON THE FARM WHICH IS HOW WE ALL WAS RAISED. I HAVE FARMED ALL MY LIFE. I WAS BORN MAY 1947 AND FARMING THE LAND IS WHAT I'VE ALWAYS DONE. THIS LAND SUSTAINED OUR FAMILY FOR YEARS. WE PLANTED CORN, TOBACCO, SOYBEANS, PEAS, TOMATOES, MUSTARD AND COLLARD GREENS, A SOUTHERN BLACK LAND STEWARDS PRESENTED BY LOLA HAMPTON-FRANK PINDER CENTER FOR AGROECOLOGY

VARIETY OF BEANS, GRAIN SORGHUM, COTTON AS WELL AS NUMEROUS OTHER CROPS.

IN ADDITION TO CROPS WE RAISED CATTLE, HOGS, AND CHICKENS TO SELL AND FOR FOOD FOR OUR FAMILY. MY MOTHER CANNED A VARIETY OF VEGETABLES. WE GREW SUGAR CANE TO MAKE OUR OWN SYRUP. WE HAD A VARIETY OF FRUIT AND PECAN TREES. WE MILKED COWS FOR MILK. THE LAND WE OWNED PROVIDED ALMOST EVERYTHING WE NEEDED. OUR FAMILY RARELY HAD TO GO TO TOWN FOR FOOD SUPPLIES.

IN 1967 I MARRIED MY WIFE OF 55 YEARS. WE ADDED AN ADDITIONAL 55 ACRES OF LAND THAT MY WIFE INHERITED FROM HER GREAT GRANDMOTHER. WE RAISED 5 CHILDREN ON THAT LAND. WE CONTINUE TO FARM TO THIS VERY DAY.

WE WORK HARD TO INSTILL IN OUR CHILDREN AND GRANDCHILDREN THE IMPORTANCE OF OWNING LAND. WE WANT YOUNG PEOPLE TO LEARN TO GROW THEIR FOOD FOR THEMSELVES AND OTHERS. THEY NEED TO KNOW THE VALUE OF GROWING HEALTHY NUTRITIOUS FOOD AND THE VALUE OF OWNING LAND TO PASS ON TO OTHER GENERATIONS. WE LOVE FARMING AND WE LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH FAMU AGRICULTURE DEPARTMENT AS THEY AID AND PROVIDE GUIDANCE TO OUR SMALL FARM.










HENRY FAMILY FARM AT BRADFORDVILLE IS ESTABLISHED IN REMEMBRANCE OF ALLEN HENRY, SR. AND EBBYE COLSON HENRY WHO WERE STRONG ADVOCATES OF FAMILY, EDUCATION, COMMUNITY AND SUSTAINABLE MEANS OF PROVIDING HEALTHY FOOD TO THE COMMUNITY. IT IS THE FIRST BLACK FARM IN FLORIDA TO GROW INDUSTRIAL HEMP AS PART OF THE STATE'S PILOT PROGRAM. SITUATED ON 30 ACRES, THE RURAL "FREEDMANS LAND" SITE IS HOME TO MORE THAN 100 YEARS OF TRADITION, INCLUDING THE DEFENSE OF THE LAND FROM "SETTLERS" FROM GEORGIA PRIOR TO STATEHOOD DURING THE SEMINOLE WARS, AND A DECEMBER 26TH BONFIRE, "SHOOTIN' MATCH," AND GELEBRATION THAT WAS A RESPITE FROM ENSLAVEMENT

PRIOR TO THE CIVIL WAR. THE SACRED LAND WAS DEEDED BY ORDER OF A JUDGE TO A MATRIARCH, FLORIDA KNIGHT (MOTHER OF ALLEN HENRY, SR.), WHO THEN DIVIDED AND PASSED THE HEIRS' PROPERTY TO HER FOUR SONS. PRIOR TO WWII, THE FARMING FAMILY WAS ORGANIZED AS A PART OF AN EARLIER BLACK FARMING COOPERATIVE OF COOPERATIVES THAT SPANNED THE DEEP SOUTH.

THE FARM IS ALSO THE SITE OF THE BRADFORDVILLE BLUES CLUB AND THE HISTORIC MISSISSIPPI BLUES TRAIL MARKER:

THE BRADFORDVILLE BLUES CLU

WAS AWARDED A MISSISSIPPI BLUES TRAIL MARKER BY THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI BLUES COMMISSION FOR THE HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CLUB AND THE BLUES TO FLORIDA. IT IS THE FIRST MISSISSIPPI BLUES TRAIL MARKER IN FLORIDA AND THE ONLY ONE AWARDED TO A CLUB.
